

SECOND CALL International Symposium Figurines in northern Greece from prehistory until the Roman times October 11-13, 2018 Archaeological Museum of Thessaloniki

Dear colleagues, following the First Call regarding the intention of the Archaeological Museum of Thessaloniki to organize an international scientific symposium dedicated to clay figurines in northern Greece from prehistory until the Roman times, we invite the submission of papers.

The suggested topics of the symposium are the following:

Typology and iconography: Figurines in specific contexts (sacred, domestic, funerary, etc.); closed contexts; iconographic types; identification and diffusion

Workshops and construction techniques, production centers: Production, questions of specialization, decoration, organization and spatial arrangement within workshops, coroplasts and workshops, interactions between areas and/or production centers, local production and imitations

Patterns of distribution: Exchanges; trade; interractions between market and production; the role of clientele

Uses (sacred, domestic, funerary, etc.) and users: presentation of unpublished closed contexts and well-dated individual artefacts; unpublished material of recent excavations and reviewing of older material

Archaeometry: Use of archaeometric methods and new technologies to determine technical data

Theoretical approaches: Interpretations; symbolic and ideological concepts; anthropological approaches; social identities; historiography of research

Terminology issues

We would warmly invite papers presenting unpublished material. The themes are conventionally delimited and consequently a topic may fall into more than one category. The Scientific Committee reserves the right not to accept proposals, if it considers that they do not fit within the above mentioned framework.

The official languages of the symposium are Greek and English. We invite proposals for individual papers and panels.
